

Mr. Steuart of Baltimore city, chairman of the committee therein mentioned, delivered the following report:

The select committee to which was referred the bill from the senate, entitled, An act for the dispatch of business in Baltimore county court, beg leave to report the same without amendment; and the said committee to which was re-committed the bill originated in this house, entitled, An act for the dispatch of business in Baltimore county court, beg leave to report, as a substitute for the same, the accompanying bill, entitled, An act for the compensation of the judges of Baltimore county court.

The said report and the accompanying bills therein mentioned, were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Sutton from the select committee to which had been referred the bill from the senate, entitled, An act for the preservation of wild fowl in the waters of Bush river and Rumney creek, reported verbally, that the said committee having considered said bill, a majority of the committee were of the opinion that it ought to pass without amendment.

The said bill was then read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. M. Mahon of Baltimore city, chairman of the select committee, to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled, An act to amend the charter of the Maryland Insurance Company

Mr. Turner, chairman of the committee on divorces, to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Ellen Streby, of Anne-Arundel county.

Mr. Steuart of Baltimore city, chairman of the select committee, to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled, An act to exempt the property of the Grand Lodge of Maryland from taxation.

Mr. Stewart of Anne Arundel, chairman of the select committee, to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the building of a bridge over the Patuxent river, at the place called Mullikin's Ford.

Mr. Gantt, Chairman of the select committee, to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled, An act to open a road from Calvert's Mill, near the Woodyard, to intersect the road commonly known as, and called The New Cut Road, near Bell's meeting-house, in Prince George's county.

Mr. Bowlus, chairman of the select committee to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled, An act incorporating a company for the improvement of the public road from the city of Frederick to Harpers's Ferry.
