

plicable to such dispositions of personal property of small value, as shall be made by raffle or lot, and which shall not be intended as evasions of the lottery system.'

Insert after the 16th section, the following as an additional section, to come in before the 17th section, viz.

'And be it enacted, That the 10th, 11th, 12th and 13th sections of an act, entitled, An act to amend the lottery system, chap. 160, passed at December session, 1827, shall be, and they hereby are, made applicable as follows, that is to say, the 10th section thereof shall be considered as applicable to the 6th section, and the 11th section to the 7th, and the 12th section to the 8th, and the 13th section to the 9th; any thing in the said original act contained to the contrary notwithstanding.'

To advance the number of the several sections of the bill so as to conform to the foregoing amendments.

The said report, and the bill therein mentioned, were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion by Mr. Done, the said report was ordered to be printed forthwith.

Mr. Lee, chairman of the committee on internal improvement, delivered the following report:

The committee on internal improvement, to whom was referred the various memorials and counter memorials on the subject of the turnpike charter prayed for between Leesborough; in Montgomery county, and New-Market in Frederick county, have given to the same a full consideration, and believing it judicious to gratify a large district of country, in such accommodations as may prove beneficial to the interests of its population, where such a grant may not be likely to conflict with the general interests of society at large, or with vested rights; ask leave to recommend the passage of the accompanying bill to authorise and provide for the construction of the road prayed for.
