

Mr. Burchenal moved further to amend the proposed amendment, by appending at the end of the first section, the following words:

'And any person obtaining such a license, shall be compelled to return said license to the clerk at the expiration of the time for which it was granted.'

And the question thereon being taken, was determined in the negative.

The question was then taken on the adoption of the amendment proposed by Mr. Done, as amended, and resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Ely, the third section of the bill was amended, by striking out the words, 'or any article of diet,' in the fourth line of that section.

Mr. Ely moved further to amend the third section of the bill, by striking out the words, 'three dollars,' in the fifth line of that section, and inserting in lieu thereof, 'one dollar and fifty cents.'

Mr. Semmes called for a division of the question on this motion, and it was put on striking out. Determined in the negative.

The question was then propounded, Shall the said bill pass, as amended? And it was resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Done, the title of said bill was then amended, to read thus, 'An act relating to the owners and occupants of the shad, herring and ale-wise fisheries in any of the waters of this state.'

On motion by Mr. Gantt,

The house then adjourned until this evening six o'clock.
