On motion by Mr. Hughlett, the second section of the said bill was reconsidered; and he then moved to amend the same, by striking therefrom, these words, in the third and fourth lines of that section, in the printed bill, viz. 'five hundred shares shall be reserved for subscription by the state of Maryland and.'

And, on the question, Will the house agree to the proposed amendment? It was determined in the negative.
