

On motion by Mr. Lee, the several blanks in the 15th section of the bill, were respectively filled up in the manner proposed by him.

On motion by Mr. Lee, the said bill was further amended, by inserting at the end thereof, as an additional section, the following, viz.

'And be it enacted, That if the said company shall not commence the said turnpike within two years from the passage of this act, and commencing the same, shall not complete or finish said turnpike within seven years thereafter, this act shall be null and void.'

On motion by Mr. Burchenal, the said bill was further amended, by inserting at the end thereof, as an additional section, the following, viz.

'And be it enacted, That the said company shall be liable to the same taxes that are imposed on other incorporated companies of this state, of a similar character.'

The said bill having been read throughout, and amended as above stated, the question was put, Shall the said bill pass as amended?

It was resolved in the affirmative; and the said bill was then sent to the senate for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Kemp, the bill reported by him, entitled, An act to confirm the marriage of Basil Grimes and Mary Grimes, of Frederick county, was taken up for consideration, by a special leave of the house, read the second time, passed without amendment, and sent to the senate for concurrence.

The report, made on the 17th instant, from the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, to which had been referred the petition of Dennis O. Bryan, a soldier of the revolutionary war, was taken up for consideration and read the second time. The report was concurred in; and the resolution therein contained, being assented to, was sent to the senate for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Beckett, the report made on the 23d instant, from the committee on claims, to which had been referred the claim of Thomas Kennedy, late state's agent for the western shore, on the state of Maryland, was taken up for consideration, by a special leave of the house, and read the second time. After some debate thereon,

The question was put, Will the house concur in said report, and assent to the resolution therein contained?

It was resolved in the affirmative; and the resolution was sent to the senate for concurrence.
