Mr. Done from the joint Library committee, delivered the following report.

The joint committee on the library have taken into consideration the several orders and resolutions referred to them, and ask leave to submit the following resolutions, viz:

Resolved by the general assembly of Maryland, That the governor, be and he is hereby requested, to exchange the Reports of adjudged cases in the Court of Appeals of this state, for the reports of the cases adjudged in the supreme court of any other state; and he is requested to correspond with the executive of the other states in the union on this subject.

Resolved, That the Librarian be and he is hereby authorised, under the directions of the joint committee appointed at the present session, or those which may be appointed at the future sessions of the legislature. to dispose of by sale, or otherwise, the following books, now in the library; and the joint committee shall invest the proceeds in other books, such as they may select, for the use of the library, viz. twenty sets of Harris and Johnson's Reports; all the volumes of the laws of Maryland, including Kilty's Index, after reserving twenty five sets for the use of the legislature; all the Reports of the English Statutes, except twenty five copies, provided the price shall not be less than one dollar per copy; all the acts of congress, journals of congress, documents, state papers and reports, after reserving five sets complete.

Resolved, That one set of the acts of congress, out of those authorised to be disposed of, be furnished to the office of the Adjutant General of this state.
