Pursuant to said order, the return with the appended note, therein referred to, is here entered, *in extenso*, as follows:

To the Honorable the Chancellor
of the State of Maryland.

Whereas, An election for four Delegates for Allegany county, to the General Assembly of Maryland, was held on the first Monday in October eighteen hundred and twenty-nine, in the districts of the said county, distinguished by numbers one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight and nine, conformably to the constitution and laws of this State. And whereas, We the subscribers, attending judges at the close of the election in said districts, having this day assembled at the usual place of the sitting of the county court of the said county, with the books of the polls, on which are endorsed the several certificates agreeably to law; and having cast up the whole number of votes given in the said districts, according to the respective certificates made out on the day of election by the judges, it appears that William McMahan, Robert Swan, and William V. Buskirk, have the greatest number of legal votes; whereupon we do declare and return that the said William McMahan, Robert Swan and William V. Buskirk, are duly elected Delegates for Allegany county, to the General Assembly of Maryland; and that John McNeill, jr. and John A. Hoffman, have an equal number of legal votes as Delegates for Allegany county to the General Assembly of Maryland.
