Ordered, That the said report be referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

And delivered the documents which had accompanied the Governor's message of yesterday to the Senate, endorsed, referred to the consideration of this House.

Ordered, That so much of the Executive communication as relates to the public printing, be referred to the Joint Committee appointed on that subject:

That so much thereof as relates to the public arms and to the militia, be referred to the Committee on the Militia.

That so much thereof as relates to the state warehouses for the inspection of tobacco; also so much thereof as relates to the public expenditures and the assessments of county charges, and to the reduction of the number of public officers, be severally referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

That so much thereof as relates to internal trade, and to surveys, canals and rail roads, be referred to the Committee on Internal Improvement.

That so much thereof as relates to the Penitentiary, be referred to the Committee on Crimes and Punishments.

That so much thereof as relates to the employment of auxiliary counsel on behalf of the state, and to the Attorney General, be referred to the Committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

That so much thereof as relates to the education of the deaf and dumb, and to the public instruction of youth throughout the state, be referred to the Committee on Education.

That so much thereof as relates to communications from the states of Louisiana, Missouri and Mississippi, be referred to a Select Committee of five members; and

That so much thereof as relates to the agricultural products of the state, be referred to a committee of seven members, to be styled the Committee on Agriculture.
