

Ordered, That the said resolutions be severally engrossed.

And the said Clerk delivered a bill, originated in, and passed by, the Senate, entitled, 'a further additional supplement to the act, entitled, an act for the relief of sundry insolvent Debtors;' which said bill, being read by its title, was, on motion by Mr Done, referred to the Committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr Claude, from the Select Committee to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled an act, for the benefit of Henry W. Fitzhugh, now of the city of Annapolis.

Mr. Moores, from the Select Committee to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled an act, to appoint Jane Johnson, of Harford county, Trustee for the sale of certain land therein mentioned.

Mr. Burchenal, from the Select Committee appointed on the subject, reported a bill, entitled an act, to authorise the issuing of attachments by Justices of the Peace, for the recovery of small debts.

Mr. Hunt, from the Select Committee to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled an act, to authorise the bringing into this State the negro slave therein mentioned. And,

Mr. Turner, of Baltimore county, from the Select Committee to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled an act, to make valid a certain Deed therein mentioned.

Which said bills were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

The House proceeded to the consideration of bills entitled to a second reading by the rules of the House. When,

The bill reported by Mr. Hope, entitled, "an act to repeal an act, entitled, a further supplement to the act, entitled an act, for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties, passed at December Session, 1815, Chapter 48," was taken up, read a second time, passed without amendment, and sent to the Senate for concurrence.

The bill, reported by Mr. Dorsey, entitled, an act to confirm and make valid a Deed therein mentioned, was also taken up and read a second time;—When on motion by Mr. Buskirk, it was again laid on the table.

On motion by Mr. Dorsey, the said bill was afterwards taken up, and referred to the Committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.
