This resolution was read the first time; and

On motion by Mr. Boyer, it was laid on the table.

On motion by Mr. Hughlett, it was

Ordered, That the Committee on Ways and Means inquire whether certain alterations and modifications ought not to be made in an act passed at Dec: session 1827, ch. 117, and the several supplements thereto, to regulate the issuing of licences to traders, keepers of ordinaries and others—so as to graduate and equalise the price paid for licenees to the circumstances and business of the persons obtaining said licences.

Mr. Done submitted the following proposition to amend the standing rules and orders of the house; which was read the first time, and on his motion, ordered to lie on the table for one day, viz:

At the end of the 41st. rule, as it now reads, add the following words:

“But calls of the House shall be made if required by seven members on any other subject under the consideration of the house.”

On motion by Mr. Hope, it was

Ordered, That the Committee on the Militia be requested to enquire into the expediency of repealing so much of the third section (of an act, entitled an additional supplement to the act entitled “an act to regulate and discipline the Militia of this State,” passed at Dec. session 1824, ch. 184) which requires two company meetings annually—and to report thereon.

Mr. Nicholas asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled “a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Pittston Coal Company.”

And, on his motion, it was

Ordered, That a select committee of three members be appointed by the Speaker, to prepare and report said bill.

Messrs. Nicholas, Hunt and Johnson were appointed the said committee pursuant to the order.

The Clerk of the Senate returned the bill of this house, entitled, an act for the benefit of the German Baptist's or Tunker's Society of Frederick County; endorsed, “will pass with the proposed amendments.”

Which amendments were read the first, and, (by a special order) the second time, and severally assented to.

Ordered, That the said bill be engrossed.
