

Mr. Grason presented the petition of Nathan Allen, of Queen Anne's county, praying for a pension, in consideration of his services as a soldier during the Revolutionary war, and his advanced age and indigent circumstances; which petition was referred to the Committee on Military Pensions and Revolutionary Claims.

Mr. Wells presented a petition of Rachel Atwell, of Anne Arundel county, praying for such pecuniary relief, by a county assessment, as may seem proper and adequate for her maintenance; which petition was referred to the Committee on County Pensions.

Mr. Teackle presented a petition of William Daugherty, and others, of Somerset county, praying the passage of an act to regulate the inspection and counting of staves in this State; which petition was referred to the Committee on Inspections.

Mr. Comegys presented a memorial of Robert H. Hays, of Cecil county, praying for a law divorcing him from his wife Eleanor.

Mr. Sellman presented a petition of Richard T. White, of Anne Arundel county, praying for a law divorcing him from his wife Jane.

Mr. Johnson presented a petition of Martha A. Hollingsworth, of Baltimore county, praying for a law divorcing her from her husband Doctor Parker Hollingsworth.

Mr. Nicholas presented a petition of Ann Matthews, of the city of Baltimore, praying for a law divorcing her from her husband Thomas Matthews.

Mr. Hunt presented a petition of Eliza Barbine, of the city of Baltimore, praying for a law divorcing her from her husband Joseph Barbine.

Ordered, That the said memorial and four last mentioned petitions be severally referred to the Committee on Divorces.

Mr. Hunt also presented a petition of Isaac Coale, of Harford county, praying the passage, for his relief, of a special act of insolvency; which petition was referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. Hunt, Nicholas, and Ely.

Mr. Shriver presented a petition of sundry citizens of Frederick county, praying for a supplement to the act, entitled, an act for the construction of a canal through Frederick county, whereby the amount of the capital stock of the Canal Company may be increased, and the said company vested with certain powers therein mentioned; which petition was referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. Shriver, Kinzer, and Dorsey.
