The Clerk of the Senate returned the several bills and resolutions of this House, of the following titles:

An act to alter and repeal the act, entitled, an act to alter the present mode of appointing the Justices of the Levy Court of Dorchester county, so that each election district may have one member, passed at December session eighteen hundred and twenty-three, chapter thirty-six; endorsed, "will pass."

A resolution providing for the payment to John McNeill, junior and Philip B. Travilla, their per diem allowance for attendance at the Seat of Government, as Delegates elect, from the counties of Allegany and Kent, previously to their admission to take seats, as members, in the House of Delegates, agreeably to its decisions. And,

A resolution in favor of Cephas W. Benson; severally endorsed, "assented to."

Ordered, That the said bill and resolutions be severally engrossed.

An act to appoint commissioners to establish the boundary line between Harford and Cecil counties; endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendments." Which amendments were read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

A further supplement to the act, entitled, an act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein mentioned; endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment." Which amendment was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

A resolution in favor of John J. Jacob, late an officer in the Revolutionary war; endorsed, "dissented from."
