

And thereupon Messrs. Hicks, Hardcastle, and Goldsborough, were appointed a select committee to prepare and report said bill.

Mr. Dorsey, from the select committee, to which the subject had been referred, reported two resolutions, one providing for the relief of the securities of Daniel H. Bingham; in a bond given to the State for the payment of rent that may be due by him for the use of the State's property in Frederick city; and the other providing for the preservation and safe keeping of said property.

The said resolutions being read the first time, were, on motion of Mr. Dorsey, read the second time, by a special order, and assented to.

Mr. Rogerson, Chairman of the Committee on Pensions and Revolutionary Claims, to which the subject had been referred, reported a resolution in favor of Sarah Gould, of Dorchester county, widow of the late William Gould, who was a soldier of the Revolutionary war; which resolution was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Buskirk, from the committee therein mentioned, delivered the following report, which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table, viz:

The Joint Committee on the Public Printing, who were required to enquire whether the printer who had contracted with said committee for the public printing of the present session, had complied with that article of his agreement, which made it imperative upon him to put on each page of the journal of the present session, as much matter as there was on a page of the journal of the last session, Report:

That, after having made an enquiry satisfactory to the committee upon the subject, they find that, in this respect, the terms of the agreement have been fully and literally complied with.

Mr. Moores moved the following resolution, which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table, viz:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Armorer at Annapolis be, and he is hereby, required to deliver to Captain George Amos, jr. of Harford county, any arms or accoutrements, not exceeding seventy of each, which the said Amos may select, on his giving such security for the safe keeping and return of the same, as the Governor and Council may require.

Mr. McMahon moved the following resolution, which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table, viz:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That
