

Mr Hunt presented a memorial of Charles Worthington, and other citizens of the city of Baltimore, praying for the passage into a law of the bill now pending before this house, entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore Sugar Refining Company; and also a memorial of George A. Hays, and other citizens of said city, counter thereto; which memorials were severally referred to the select committee to which the said bill and the counter memorial of Andrew Muncks, and others of said city, presented by Mr. Nicholas on the 15th instant, have been referred; and the said committee was further enlarged by the appointment of Mr Buchanan, as an additional member thereof, Mr Nicholas being prevented by sickness, from attending to the subject.

Mr Gale presented a memorial of the President and Directors of the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal Company, praying for the passage of an act declaratory of the true and proper meaning of the 12th and 13th sections of the original act incorporating said company.

Mr Evans, presented a memorial and petition, of Thomas Bittle, of Cecil county, counter to the last mentioned memorial.

Ordered, That the said memorials and counter-petition, with their accompanying papers and documents, be referred to the committee on Internal Improvement.

The Speaker laid before the house a report from the President of the Baltimore and Harford Turnpike Company, dated 20th instant, made under oath, in compliance with the order of this house of the 14th ultimo; which was referred to the committee on Internal Improvement.

Mr Grason, presented a petition of sundry citizens of Queen Anne's county, in relation to a tax imposed for purchasing ground and building a school house, in the primary school district No. 27, in said county; which petition was referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. Grason, Oldson and Sudler.

Mr Boyer, presented a petition of sundry citizens of Worcester county, praying for the repeal of the several acts of Assembly heretofore passed, and now in force, authorising the allowance of pensions to indigent persons in said county, and for the passage of a law authorising the levy court of said county, in their discretion, to levy such sum or sums of moeay, as they may deem proper and necessary, for the annual maintenance of indigent applicants for pensions, upon the production of certain certificates from the Trustees of the Poor of said county; which peti-
