

the house assent to so much of the fifth of the said resolutions, as is contained in these words?"

"Resolved that the General Assembly of the State of Maryland does not concur in the resolution of the State of Mississippi, that the Tariff of 1828 is unconstitutional."

It was resolved in the affirmative by a division and count of the house; 33 members having voted affirmatively, and 8 negatively.

Mr. Jenifer then moved to strike out the residue of the fifth of the said resolutions, being in these words:

"And oppressive, but that a constitutional opposition by those who may feel themselves aggrieved by its operation meets our entire approbation."

And the question on this motion being put,

It was determined in the negative on a division and count of the house; there having appeared 6 members voting affirmatively, and 46 negatively.

The residue of the fifth of the said resolutions, above stated, was then assented to by the house.

The sixth of the said resolutions was amended, by striking out the words, "report and," where they occur in the 2d and in the 6th and 7th lines, of the manuscript report.

The question being then put, "Will the house assent to the sixth of the said resolutions, as amended?"

It was resolved in the affirmative by a division and count of the house; 33 members voting affirmatively, and 18 negatively.

The said report and resolutions, so amended, were then assented to.

The house proceeded to consider the report made yesterday from the Committee on Divorces, to which had been referred the petition of David S. Barnum, of the city of Baltimore, praying to be divorced from his wife Sarah Barnum; and it was read the second time; When,
