

creek in the village of Elkton, on the road leading past the site of the old market-house, towards Warwick, in said county; also the bill, entitled, An act relating to the records in the register of wills office, in Kent county; also the bill, entitled, An act to authorise Mary Lyon to lease the real estate of her infant children; also the bill, entitled, An act to authorise the commissioners of Washington county to levy a sum of money for the erection of a bridge over Antietam creek, at or near M'Pherson's and Brien's furnace, on the road leading from Sharpsburgh to Harper's Ferry; also the bill, entitled, An additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the preservation of the breed of wild deer, and for other purposes therein mentioned, passed at November session 1789, chapter 5; also the bill, entitled, An act to provide for the opening of a street in Hager's-Town; also the bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors; also the bill, entitled, An act supplementary to the act passed at December session 1824, chapter 162, empowering the levy court of Harford county, in their discretion, to build a bridge over Deer creek in said county; also the bill, entitled, An act to prevent gaming, were sent to the senate. And the bill, entitled, An act to confirm an act, entitled, An act to regulate the removal of proceedings in criminal cases, and to make certain changes in the constitution and form of government for that purpose, was returned to the senate.

Mr. M'Elfresh presented the petition of sundry citizens of Frederick county, adverse to the division of Middletown district in said county.

Also the petition of sundry citizens of Frederick county, praying a confirmation of the law of last session, for the division of Middletown district; which were read and severally referred to Messrs. M'Elfresh, Richardson, Kemp and M'Kinstrey.

And the petition of Ezra Slifer, and others, of Frederick county, counter to the petition of sundry citizens of Burkittsville, praying for a road therein mentioned; which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Montgomery presented the petition of sundry citizens of Harford county, praying the passage of an act directing the commissioners of said county to levy a sum of money sufficient to open and make a road from Watter's meeting house, on 'Thomas' run, to the public road leading from Baltimore to Conowingo bridge, over the Susquehanna
