

Mr. Biles reported a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate certain persons therein mentioned, for the purpose of establishing a school called the Liberty Grove School, of Cecil county.

Mr. Willson, reported a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the extension and construction of a road from Unity, in Montgomery county, to some point on the Baltimore and Frederick turnpike in Anne-Arundel county.

Mr. Brawner reported a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to authorise equitable assignees to sue in their own names.

Mr. Teackle reported a bill, entitled, An act to graduate the pay of jurors and witnesses in this state.

Mr. Turner reported a bill, entitled, An act relating to the recording of certain proceedings in Baltimore county court.

Mr. Watters reported a bill, entitled, An act empowering the commissioners of Harford county, to build a bridge over Winter's run, in said county, at or near the place where the road leading from Gunpowder neck to Belle Air, crosses said run.

Mr. Comegys reported a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Susanna Holmes, of Baltimore county. And

Mr Hood reported a bill, entitled, An act prescribing the duties of the several armourers of this state; which were severally read.

Mr. Nicholas from the select committee, made a favourable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled, An act relating to the police of the city of Baltimore; which was read.

The house then proceeded to consider the order of the day, it being the bill, entitled, An act to provide for making a rail road from Baltimore to the city of Washington; When

On motion by Mr. Wootton, the house also took up for consideration the bill, entitled, An act to authorise the extension and construction of a rail road from some point on the Baltimore and Ohio rail road, to the line of the District of Columbia, in the direction of the city of Washington.

On motion by Mr. Nicholas, the house resolved itself into a committee of the whole house, for the purpose of considering said bills; and after some time spent therein, the speaker resumed the chair, when Mr. Lee, the chairman, reported that the said committee had, according to order, had the said bills under consideration, and having made some progress therein, directed him to ask leave to sit again; which leave was granted by the house.
