

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Mary Benson, widow of Gen. Perry Benson, or order, during her widowhood, in quarter yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a captain, in consideration for the services of her late husband during the revolutionary war.

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, the report concurred in, and the resolution therein contained assented to, and sent to the senate.

The favourable report of the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims to whom was referred the order instructing them to inquire into the propriety of allowing to Jannett Lingan, widow of Gen. James M. Lingan, deceased, a pension, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, the report concurred in, and the resolution therein contained assented to, and sent to to the senate.

Mr. Smith moved to suspend the order of the house adopted on the inst. relative to originating no new business, for the purpose of offering a resolution.

On the question being put, Will the house suspend the order? It was determined in the negative.

Mr. Chapman from the committee on ways and means, made a favourable report on the petition of Nancy Stallings of Allegany county, praying relief, accompanied with the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all proceedings on the state's judgment against the representative of Thomas Stallings, one of the securities of Thomas Pollard, be suspended until the 1st day of January 1835, provided, that one fifth of the balance now remaining due, with interest on the whole sum, be paid on or before the first day of January next, and the balance with interest on the sum due, in four equal annual instalments.

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Port Deposit Library Company; also the bill, entitled, An act to authorise a subscription to the capital stock of the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company, severally endorsed "will pass."
