And the resolutions in favor of Mary Eason, widow of Evans Willin;

And Lydia Brown and Ann Hill, legal representatives of Richard Hill; were sent to the senate.

Mr. Hunt presented the petition of Luther J. Cox and Maria his wife, of the city of Baltimore, praying the passage of an act authorising them to lease certain property therein mentioned; which was read and referred to Messrs. Hunt, Laurenson and Turner, of Baltimore.

Mr. Moores presented the petition of sundry citizens of Harford county, praying an amendment to the charter of the Abington Academy in said county; which was read and referred to the committee on education.

Mr. Laurenson presented the petition of Mary Dashiell, of the city of Baltimore, praying that a petition to open a certain road in Baltimore county, may be referred to the commissioners of said county; which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Ely presented the petition of John Evans, of Baltimore county, praying relief; which was read and referred to Messrs. Ely, Stansbury and Holmes.

Mr. Nicols presented the memorial of William K. Lambdin, treasurer of the Eastern Shore, praying an increase of his salary; which was read and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Mr. Moores presented the petition of sundry citizens of Harford county, praying for an act authorising the appointment of commissioners, to fix on a site for a bridge over Deer creek, at Death's Ford or Wilson's Mill, or some point between, them and for other purposes; which was read and referred to Messrs. Moores, Amos and Johns.

Mr. Brawner presented the petition of Marsham Queen and others, of Charles county, praying the passage of an act to confirm a sale therein mentioned; which was read and referred to Messrs. Brawner, Rogerson and Turner, of Charles;

And presented the petition of Frances Goodrick, of Charles county, praying to be placed on the pension list of said county; which was read and referred to the committee on pensions to indigent persons by county assessment.
