

ration, and, having adopted sundry amendments thereto, he was directed to report the same to the house, with the said bill, and to ask that the said committee be discharged from the further consideration of the subject:—Whereupon the said committee of the whole house was accordingly discharged.

The said bill and amendments as reported by the committee of the whole house, were then read.

Mr. Brookhart moved to amend said bill by striking out in the first section, third line, the word "four," and insert in lieu thereof the word "two."

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Roberts moved to amend said bill by striking out in the first section, eleventh line, from the word "delegates," to the words "and the persons," in the thirteenth line, and insert in lieu thereof the following:

Harford, Cecil, Kent, Queen Anne's, and Caroline counties, shall constitute a fifth district, and be entitled to elect three delegates; Talbot, Dorchester, Worcester, and Somerset, shall constitute a sixth district, and be entitled to elect three Delegates.

Determined in the negative.
