

The bill reported by Mr. Duvall, of Anne Arundel, entitled, an act to amend the act, entitled, an act to make valid the instrument of writing therein mentioned;

And the bill reported by Mr. Hammond, entitled, An act for the relief of Jacob Harris; were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time and passed.

On motion by Mr. Holmes, the house took up for consideration the bill reported by Mr. Jenkins, entitled, A supplement to an act entitled, an act to provide for the public printing of the State passed December session 1831; chapter 303.

On motion by Mr. Cottman, said bill was amended by adding at the end thereof as additional sections the following.

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the printer chosen by the joint committee on Printing, shall give bond with approved security, for fidelity and accuracy in printing, and promptitude in distributing the laws.

Sec 4. *And be it enacted*, That the Printer shall be required, in a bond to be given to and approved by the joint committee, to transmit to the editors of each newspaper in the State, in sheets, as soon as they are printed and before they are bound, one copy of the laws passed at the session of the Legislature to which he is printer; and certificates of receipt by the clerks of the county and editors of the State, shall be vouchers from the printer for settlement.

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, and passed.

The bill from the Senate, entitled, an act supplementary to an act, regulating the Inspection of Green Hides and Skins, in the city of Baltimore, was taken up for consideration.

Mr. Jenkins moved to lay the bill on the table.

Determined in the negative.

The said bill was then read the second time and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Slicer, entitled, An act to make valid a certain patent granted to Meshac Browning, of Allegany county, was taken up for consideration;

When, on motion by Mr. Bruce, said bill was ordered to lie on the table

The bill reported by Mr. Jenkins, entitled, An act to authorize the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, to alter the width of a part of Canal, formerly Harford-street; of a part of Spring-street; of a part of Strawberry alley, and to close Russel lane, was taken up for consideration.

On motion by Mr. Jenkins, said bill was amended, by
