Which was read and referred to Messrs. Jump, Carter, and Charles.

Mr. Mann presented a petition of the commissioners of Washington county, praying to be authorised to levy money to defray the extraordinary charges growing out of the visitation of Cholera, and other purposes therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Mann, Grove and Hollman.

Mr. Burgess presented a petition of Nathan Haines, of Anne Arundel county, praying the Legislature to annul a certain deed therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Burgess, Duvall of Anne Arundel, and Compton.

Mr. Richardson, of Caroline, presented a petition of Stephen J. Bradley, of Caroline county, praying the repeal of a law therein named;

Which was read, and referred to Messrs. Richardson of Caroline, Jump and Charles.

Mr. Forwood presented a petition of Thomas T. Richardson, of Harford county; And

Mr. Johns presented a petition of Benjamin Gibson, and his son James T. Gibson, of Harford county, severally praying to be placed on the pension list of said county.

Which were severally read and referred to the Committee on pensions to indigent persons by county assessments.

Mr. Brewer presented a petition of Richard Brown, praying for the passage of an act to authorize the removal from this state of certain servants for terms of years;

Which was read and referred to the committee on the colored population.

Mr. Hope presented a petition of Christian Henrich Bastor, praying the passage of a law to make valid a deed herein mentioned, which was read and referred to Messrs. Hope, Forwood and Sutton.

Mr. Jones presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Somerset county, setting forth the evils of the numerous stores for the sale of ardent spirits, and praying that the Legislature may restrict the number by requiring applicants for licenses to retail ardent spirit, to produce to the clerk of the county, a recommendation signed by twelve respectable freeholders living within five miles of such store.

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.
