Mr. Harper presented a memorial of the President and Directors of the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company, praying for further assistance to enable them to prolong the road to Westminster; which was read and referred the committee on internal improvement.

Mr. Pratt presented a petition of Charles Hill, of Prince George's county, praying to be allowed to bring into this state, from the District of Columbia, certain negroes;

And, Mr. Weast presented a petition of Wm. R. Abbott, of Washington county, praying for an act to authorise him to bring into this state certain slaves therein named;

Which were read and severally referred to the committee on the colored population.

Mr. Harper presented the memorial of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, praying for relief from the influx of foreign paupers; which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice;

Also, presented a petition of John Sands of the city of Baltimore, praying to be divorced from his wife Bathiah; which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

Mr. Jenkins presented a petition of Cornelia A. Howard, praying for the passage of an act to explain an act entitled,
