Mr. Teackle, chairman of the committee on ways and means, reported a bill, entitled, an act to establish the Bank of the State of Maryland.

Which was read.

Mr. Richardson, of Caroline, reported a bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of Thomas C. Carter, late Sheriff of Caroline county.

Mr. Compton, chairman of the committee on divorces, reported a bill, entitled, an act to divorce George Twilly and Priscilla Twilly, of Worcester county.

Mr. Burgess reported a bill, entitled, an act to abrogate and annul a certain deed therein mentioned.

Mr. Ely reported a bill, entitled, an act to repeal an act, passed at December session eighteen hundred and twenty-seven, chapter eighty-three; And,

Mr. Teackle, from the committee on ways and means, reported a bill, entitled, a further additional supplement to the act of December session, 1827, chapter 117, entitled, an act to regulate the issuing of licenses to traders, keepers of ordinaries and others; which were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

The house proceeded to consider the unfinished business of yesterday, being the bill reported by Mr. Merrick, entitled, an act for the relief of John D. Freeman, of Charles county.

On motion by Mr. Teackle, said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The house adjourned until Monday morning 10 o'clock.

MONDAY, February 4th, 1833.

The house met; present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The bill entitled, an act to authorize Clement McWilliams, of Saint Mary's county, to bring certain slaves into this State; was sent to the Senate.
