Whereas, the General Assembly at the last session, adopted a resolution authorizing the appointment of a commissioner or engineer to superintend a survey of the sounds between the capes of Virginia and Delaware; and it is believed that in a concern of so much importance to a portion of the people of this state, the services of an additional Commissioner or Engineer may be necessary and valuable; Therefore,

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Governor and Council be and they are hereby authorized to appoint an additional Commissioner or Engineer, to co-operate in the contemplated survey.*

Resolved, That his Excellency the Governor, be requested to correspond with the Executive authorities of Virginia and Delaware, with the view of fixing a time and place for the meeting of the Commissioners.

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
