

Mr. Weast presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Washington county;

And Mr. Mann, presented a memorial of sundry citizens of said county, severally praying the Legislature to adopt measures to compel the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, to permit the passage of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company, to pass their work through the narrows between the Point of Rocks and Harper's Ferry;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on internal improvements.

Mr. Jenkins presented a petition of Sarah Gilmore, of the city of Baltimore, praying for a divorce a vinculo matrimonii;

And Mr. Weast presented a petition of Barbary Callahan, of Washington county, praying to be divorced from her husband Jacob Callahan; which were severally read and referred to the committee on divorces

Mr. Merrick presented a petition of the Grand and Petit Jurors of Charles county, and other citizens of said county, praying for protection to fish and wild towl on the Potomac river, and its tributaries, within said county; which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Forwood presented a petition of John Kean and others, of Harford county, praying that Nancy and Polly Baldwin, may be placed on the pension list of said county; which was read and referred to the committee on pensions, to indigent persons by county assessments.

Mr. Willson presented a petition of sundry citizens of Montgomery county, praying for a road therein mentioned; which was read and referred to Messrs. Willson, Gittings and White.

Mr. Ely presented a petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore and Anne Arundel counties, praying relief from the oppressive regulations of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company, by the repeal of the second, third and fourth sections, of an act passed at December session 1830, chapter 117; which was read and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

Mr. Lantz presented a petition of Jacob Baker, praying permission to remove certain negroes therein mentioned, from Virginia to Allegany county Maryland.

Mr. Harding presented a petition of Samuel W. Beall, of Montgomery county, praying to be permitted to bring into this State a negro therein mentioned.
