

TUESDAY, February 19th, 1833.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The Proceedings of yesterday were read;

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Frederick A. Stewart of the city of Baltimore;

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of John Hamilton, George Hamilton, Jane Rensch, Thomas Rensch, Sarah Boren, and William C. Boren;

The bill entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, an act to authorise the rebuilding of a bridge over Conowingo creek, at or near Abijah Fens, in Cecil county, passed at December session 1831, chapter 73;

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of James Allcorn, of the city of Baltimore;

The bill entitled, An act to divorce Mary Ann Kirby, of the city of Baltimore, from her husband William Kirby;

And the resolution relative to the preservation and safe keeping of the Barracks in the city of Frederick;

Were sent to the Senate.

The bill from the Senate, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act vesting certain powers in the President of the United States, passed by this house on yesterday, with an amendment;

Was returned to the Senate.
