

THURSDAY, February 21st 1833.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, a further additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to establish pilots and regulate their fees, was sent to the senate.

Mr. Wright, of Queen Anne's, presented a petition of Jacob W. Legg, of Queen Anne's county; praying the passage of a law authorising the Vestry of Christ's church parish, to make him a deed, as therein set forth.

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Harper, presented a petition of James Carroll, of the city of Baltimore, counter to that of George Beltzhoover and others, praying for the opening of Light street, in the city of Baltimore.

Which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Also; presented a petition of Maria Barnes, of the city of Baltimore, praying to be divorced from her husband Richard H. Barnes.

Which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

Mr. Jenkins presented a petition of William Lorman, and Charles Howard, guardian of James H. McHenry, praying that an act may be passed to authorize them to make an exchange of certain property;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Jenkins, Harper, and Ely.

Mr. Jones presented a petition of Robert Twilley of Somerset county, praying to be authorized to bring into this State a certain negro slave therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to the committee on the coloured population.

And, Mr. Hammond presented a petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore county, praying that Baltimore and Frederick counties may be so divided that three counties may be made thereof;

Which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Weast obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a Female Seminary in Boonsborough in Washington county.

Ordered, that Messrs. Weast, Hollman, and Mann, report the same.
