

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Governor and Council, be, and they are hereby authorised and requested to take some immediate step to ascertain the necessity and propriety of remedying the present defects of the roof of the State House—and that they in their discretion, shall cause such repairs to be made as the circumstances of the case may demand, for the preservation and safety of the building—and that they draw on the Treasurer of the Western Shore, for such sum or sums as may be necessary to carry into execution this resolve.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay to J. J. Hitchcock, or order, ninety-two dollars, and eighty-eight cents; to Messrs. Nicklin and Johnson, or order, \$38 65, cts.—to Messrs. Cushing and sons, or order, eleven dollars—and to Messrs. Coale and Littell, or order, three hundred and fifty-two dollars and eighty-four cents—respectively due to each of them for books furnished to the State Library.

Which were severally read the first and second time by special order, and severally assented to.

Mr. Milbourne, submitted the following message; which was read, assented to, and sent to the Senate.
