

The preamble and resolutions submitted by Mr. Chandler, on the 20th of February, relative to certain records in the office of Register of Wills of Kent county, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, and assented to.

The unfavorable report of the committee on divorces, upon the petition of Lucinda Rogers, of Allegany county, praying for a divorce, and the substitute offered for said report by Mr. Louthan, being the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Lucinda Rogers of Allegany county.

Were taken up for consideration.

On the question being put, will the house adopt the substitute;

It was resolved in the affirmative.

The said bill was then read the second time and passed.

The clerk of the Senate returned the bill entitled, An act to alter and change a part of the divisional line between Dorchester and Caroline counties;

Also, the bill entitled An act authorising the Levy Court of St. Mary's county, to lay out a certain road therein mentioned;

Also, the bill entitled An act to regulate the weighing of Hay and Straw in this State;

Also, the bill entitled, An act giving compensation to Jurors in cases of forcible entry and detainer;

Also, the bill entitled, An act to incorporate the Woodborough Savings Institution.

Also, the bill entitled, An act to repeal an act therein mentioned, relating to the town of St. Michaels, in Talbot county.

Also, the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate the Liberty Town Savings Institution; severally endorsed, "will pass;" ordered to be engrossed.

And delivered a bill, originated in and passed by the Senate, entitled, A supplement to an act, for the benefit of the heirs of Mary Burkhal;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Harper, Jenkins and Ely.

Also, a bill, entitled, An act, supplementary to an act, entitled, An act to establish a Bank, and incorporate a company, under the name of "the Commercial Bank of Millington," in Kent county.

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Wickes, Chandler, Hayne, Garrettson and Jones.

The House then adjourned until Monday Morning, nine o'clock.
