

WEDNESDAY, March 6th, 1833.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, An act to change the name of Edmond Plowden, of Saint-Mary's county, to that of Edmond Paul Plowden;

Also the bill, entitled, An act to limit the time for entering and filing caveats to last wills and testaments, and for other purposes;

And the bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein mentioned, so far as relates to Harford county;

And, the resolution in favour of Samuel Graham, of Anne-Arundel county, were sent to the senate.

Mr. Hope submitted the following message; which was read, assented to, and with the bill therein mentioned, sent to the senate:—

By the House of Delegates,

March 6th, 1833.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We herewith return you a bill, entitled, An act for building a bridge across the Little Falls of Gunpowder, near Balden's Mill. The amendments added to the bill by your honourable body, and proposed for the consideration and adoption of this branch of the legislature, are deemed unnecessary on this subject, except the first amendment, inasmuch as the commissioners of Harford and Baltimore counties have, by act of legislation, the power to lay out and open roads: We, therefore, respectfully request that your honourable body will reconsider the said bill, and pass the same; without the aforesaid amendment.
