

The bill from the senate, entitled, An act for the relief of John C. Helmkin, of the city of Baltimore;

Also, the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Hester Anthony;

Also, the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate "The Cumberland Engine Company," in the town of Cumberland, in Allegany county;

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time, and passed.

The bill from the senate, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the dispatch of business, in Baltimore county court, and the amendments reported by the committee to said bill were taken up for consideration.

The amendments proposed by the committee were read the second time.

Mr. Jenkins moved that the third, fourth, and fifth sections, in the amendment proposed by said committee, be stricken out.

Resolved in the affirmative.

And, on motion by Mr. Jenkins, said bill was further amended, by striking out in the fourth line of the seventh section, the words, "no proceedings being had by the parties or any of them for any period," and inserting in lieu thereof the following, "by reason of no proceeding being had by any of the parties during any limited period;"

The said bill was then read the second time and passed with the proposed amendments.

The bill from the senate, entitled, An act relating to opening streets, lanes and alleys, laid out by the present plan of the city of Baltimore, was taken up for consideration, read the second time and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Ellicott, entitled, An act supplemental to an act, entitled, An act to provide for building a bridge over the Patapsco Falls, at or near the Thistle Factory, passed at December session, 1831, chapter 27, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, and passed.

On motion by Mr. Schley, the house took up for consideration the amendments proposed by the senate to the bill, entitled, An act empowering the Frederick county court, sitting as a court of equity, to decree and order the sale of certain real estate;

The said amendments were then read the second time, severally assented to; and the bill ordered to be engrossed.
