

Which having been read;

Mr. Harris submitted the following message:

By the House of Delegates.

Jan. 27th, 1834.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We propose with your concurrence to appoint a joint committee of two members of this house, and one from your honorable body, to visit the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road, to enquire into the financial concerns, and future prospects of said road, and report thereon.

We have appointed Messrs. _____ on the part of this house, to join the gentlemen to be selected by your honorable body.

Which having been read,

Mr. Long rose to a question of order,

The house having refused at an earlier day of the session to appoint a select committee on the part of the house, to visit said road.

Mr. Blakistone (in the Chair) gave it as his opinion that the said message was in order, from which decision Mr. Long appealed to the house, and the question being put,

“Shall the decision of the chair stand as the judgment of the house.”

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Crabb then moved that said message and report be laid upon the table.

Upon which the question was put; and resolved in the affirmative.

The house then adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

TUESDAY, January, 28, 1834.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.
