

reported by Mr. Franklin Smith, entitled, a further supplement to the act passed December session, 1816, chapter 199, regulating the cording of firewood, in the city of Baltimore, being the first order of the day.

Mr. Burchenal moved to amend the said bill by striking out from the word "Maryland," in the first section, to the word "that," in the 2d section.

Mr. Mordecai F. Smith moved to lay the said bill on the table;

Resolved in the affirmative.

The house then proceeded to take up for consideration the second order of the day, being the bill reported by Mr. Handy, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act to incorporate a bank at Salisbury, to be called by the name of "The Bank of Salisbury," passed at December session, 1829.

Mr. Long moved to strike out the first section of the bill.

On which the question was put and determined in the negative.

Mr. Palmer moved to amend the bill by striking out after the word "Maryland," to the end of the bill, and inserting in lieu thereof the following: "That the thirteenth section of the act, entitled, an act to incorporate a bank at Salisbury, passed at the December session, 1829, chapter 84, be and the same is hereby repealed."

Mr. Fassitt moved to postpone the further consideration of said bill, and make it the order of the day for Monday next.

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put on the adoption of the amendment proposed by Mr. Palmer, and it was resolved in the affirmative:

Mr. Griffith moved further to amend said bill by adding at the end thereof the following proviso: "Provided, nevertheless, that no note shall be discounted except at said bank."

Resolved in the affirmative.

The said bill having been read a second time as amended, the question was put, "shall the bill pass."

Determined in the negative.
