

Goldsberry, of Saint Mary's county, severally praying for pensions, accompanied with the following resolutions:

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Ann Goldsberry, of St. Mary's county, or to her order, during life, in quarter yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, in consideration of the services rendered by her husband during the revolutionary war.*

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Sarah Simmons, of Charles county, or to her order during life, in quarter yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, in consideration of the services rendered by her husband, during the revolutionary war.*

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the western shore, be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay to Jane Roberts of Allegany county, or to her order during life, in quarter yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, in consideration of the services rendered by her husband during the revolutionary war;*

Which were severally read the first and second time by special order, concurred in, and the resolutions therein contained assented to.

Mr. Merrick submitted the following resolution, which was read the first and second time by special order, and assented to.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to apply so much of the money of the state now on special deposite to the demands upon the Treasury during the current year, as may be necessary, in addition to the ordinary receipts of the Treasury, to meet those demands.*

Mr. Long from the committee on inspections, reported a bill, entitled, a further supplement to an act, passed at December session, 1825, chap. 174;

Which was read the first and second time by special order;

When Mr. Sifford moved the following as a substitute for the said bill, "a bill entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act to authorise the Governor and Council of Maryland to appoint the inspectors of flour for this state, passed at December session, 1825, chap. 174."
