

Mr. Peregoy from the select committee to which was referred the bill from the senate, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act for the widening of Orange Alley, in the city of Baltimore, passed at December session, 1827, chapt. 124, reported the same with the following amendment.

Amendment proposed.

Strike out after the word "at," in the 5th line, first section, to the end of the section.

Which amendment was read the first and second time by special order, and assented to.

The said bill was then read the second time, passed with the proposed amendment, and returned to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Spencer, the amendments proposed by the senate to the bill entitled, a supplement to an act to provide for the public instruction of youth, in primary schools, throughout this state;

Were taken up for consideration, read the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The bill entitled, an additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate the Town of Williamsport, in Washington county, passed at December session, 1823, chapter 125.

The bill reported by Mr. Gantt, entitled, an act to regulate the jail fees, relative to runaway negroes in Prince George's county.

The bill reported by Mr. Linthicum, entitled, an act to authorise the repair of the bridge over Patapsco Falls, at Ellicott's Old Upper Mills.

The bill also reported by Mr. Linthicum, entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Anne Arundel county.

The bill reported by Mr. Day, chairman of the committee on expiring laws, entitled, an act to continue in force the acts of Assembly, which would expire with the present session of the General Assembly;

And, the bill reported by Mr. Gantt, entitled, an act to authorise the clerk of Prince George's county court to record a certain deed therein mentioned;

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Ely from the committee to which was referred the bill from the senate, entitled, an act relating to the pay of the judges of the orphans court of Baltimore county, made an unfavorable report thereon.

The said bill was then read the second time, rejected and returned to the senate.
