

TUESDAY, January 20th, 1835.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. McMahon presented a petition of sundry inhabitants of the second election district of Allegany county, praying an alteration in the License Law.

Which was read and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Mr. Ely presented a petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore and Anne Arundel counties, praying the repeal of an act, passed at December session, 1833, prohibiting the riding on horseback on the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road.

Which was read, and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Ely also presented a petition of Isabella P. Baltz, of Baltimore county, praying to be divorced from her husband, John Baltz.

Which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

Mr. Cushing presented a petition of Margaret Davis, of the city of Baltimore, widow of Samuel Davis, deceased, a revolutionary soldier, praying that the pension allowed her late husband, may be continued to her.

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Creighton submitted the following message:
