

Resolved, That this General Assembly will appoint, by joint ballot of both houses, a special agent, who shall proceed, as soon as practicable, to the capitol of Virginia, and communicate to the General Assembly of that commonwealth, a copy of these Resolutions.

Which were read.

Mr. Jones of Somerset, moved to refer said resolutions to the committee of the whole house;

Determined in the negative.

On motion of Mr. Devecmon, said resolutions were ordered to lie on the table.

The house then adjourned until tomorrow morning ten o'clock.

WEDNESDAY, January 21st, 1835.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, an act to change the name of Nathaniel Hynson, jr. of Kent county, to that of Nathaniel Thornton Hynson;

And, the bill, entitled, an act for the revaluation of the real and personal property in Frederick county;

Were sent to the senate.

The bill from the senate, entitled, an act for the benefit of Alfred Y. Clagett and wife, passed by this house on yesterday, was returned to the senate.

Mr. Gillis presented a petition of John S. Purnell and John Mitchell, and other citizens of the third election district of Worcester county, praying the passage of an act, authorising the rebuilding of the public buildings of said county, in the town of Berlin, upon the conditions of the inhabitants of said district defraying the expenses of construction, &c.

Which was read read and referred to Messrs. Williams, Bevans, and Hearn;

Mr. Carter presented a petition of the commissioners of the tax for Caroline county, praying the passage of an act, to compel sheriffs, coroners, constables, executors, administrators, and other persons, who may sell or transfer any real or personal property within said county, to make due returns of all such property to the said commissioners yearly;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Carter, Turner of Caroline, and Burchenal.
