

Were sent to the senate.

Mr. Shower presented a petition of sundry citizens of the 8th election district in Baltimore county, praying that the lines of said district may be so altered as to include the petitioners in the seventh district;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Shower, Ely, and Orrick.

Mr. Teackle presented sundry memorials and petitions of a number of persons of different counties, setting forth the depressed condition of the agricultural and other great interests of this State, and praying the establishment of a Monetary Institution, upon an enlarged and liberal plan, for increasing the supply of circulating medium, to promote industry and enterprise, and for the general-accommodation of the people;

Which was read and referred to the committee appointed on the subject of a Real Estate Bank.

Mr. Devecmon presented two memorials of sundry citizens of Allegany county, praying the passage of an act to prevent trespass westward of Savage River in said county.

Which were severally read and referred to the select committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Brengle presented a memorial of Lewis Kemp, Elizabeth Buckley, and others, remonstrating against the passage of a law, requiring the court of Appeals to reinstate a case, &c. between the memorialist and Henry Fouke and others;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr Brengle also presented a petition of Henry Nelson and others, of Frederick county, praying the passage of an act, incorporating them under the name and style of the Trustees of the Central School of Frederick county;

Which was read and referred to committee on corporations;

And, presented a petition of William Green, praying a special act of insolvency;

Which was read and referred to the committee on insolvency.

Mr. Prait presented a petition of sundry citizens of Montgomery country, relative to the fisheries on the Potomac River;

And, Mr. Harding presented a petition of sundry citizens of Montgomery county, relating to the fisheries on the Potomac River;
