

That for the Hagerstown Bank, Daniel Weisel and Alexander Neale, Sen.

The bill, entitled, an act to authorise John Donaho, of Harford county, to construct certain wharves in the town of Havre de Grace—And,

The resolution authorising the State Librarian to furnish the Clerk of Dorchester county Court, and the Judges of the Orphan's Court of said county, with copies of the index to the laws of Maryland, were sent to the senate.

Mr. Palmer presented a petition of sundry citizens of Queen Anne's and Caroline counties, praying a farther supplement to the law of 1789, chapter 15, for the opening and keeping in repair the long marsh ditch, in said counties,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Palmer, Larrimore, Kirby, of Queen Anne's, Burchenal and Hardeastle.

Mr. Winder presented a petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore county, praying that another district may be formed of the fifth and sixth Election Districts in said county, and to change the places of holding the elections of the same,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Winder, Ely and Carroll, of Baltimore county.

Mr. Gittings presented a petition of Philip Power, of Montgomery county, praying pecuniary relief for himself and wife, by county assessment,

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions to indigent persons by county assessment.

Mr. Willis presented two memorials of sundry citizens of Frederick county, severally praying for a revision of the Constitution of this State—And,

Mr. Sutton presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Harford county, praying the call of a convention to alter and amend the present form of the State Government,

Which memorials were severally read, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Ely obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, an act relating to certain claims on Baltimore county,

Ordered, that Messrs. Ely, Carroll of Baltimore county, and Brown, report the same.

On motion of Mr. Bryan,

Ordered, that the committee on pensions to indigent persons by county assessment, enquire into the expediency of placing Susan Butler, a poor widow, on the pension roll of Prince George's county.
