

FRIDAY, February 19th, 1836.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, an act to divorce Eliza Ann Boyd, of Kent county, from her husband, James Boyd, was sent to the Senate.

The bill from the Senate, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Commercial Exchange Company of Baltimore, was returned to the senate.

Mr. Ridgely presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Anne Arundel county, counter to the memorial of Amos A. Williams and others, praying the incorporation of a Bank, to be called the Hamilton Bank,

And, Mr. Larrimore presented a petition of sundry citizens of Queen Anne's county, praying a law may pass, to prohibit the sale of ardent spirits in taverns on the Sabbath day.

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Mr. Brookhart presented a petition of sundry citizens of the town of Boonsborough, in Washington county, praying the passage of a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to incorporate the town of Boonsborough, and the several additions thereto, passed at December session 1831, chap. 139.

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Brookhart, Fiery and Newcomer,

Mr. Brohawn presented a petition of sundry citizens of Dorchester county, praying that a law may pass to prevent the destruction of oysters in Little Choptank or Hudson's river, and the creeks thereof, by persons taking the same and manuring their lands therewith,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Brohawn, Bayly and Ford.

Mr. Richardson presented a petition of the Friendship Beneficial Society of Baltimore city, praying an act of incorporation,

Which was read and referred to the committee on corporations.

Mr. Kirby, of Queen Anne's, presented a petition of sundry citizens of the village of Church Hill and vicinity, in Queen Anne's county, praying that the donation given to the Centreville Academy in said county, may be equally divided between the Academies at Church Hill and Centreville,
