Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the speedy trial of misdemeanors in the city of Baltimore,

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to locate a public landing at or near the head of tide waters of the Great Falls of Gunpower, in Baltimore county;

Also, the bill, entitled, an additional supplement to the act, entitled, an act for the erecting of a bridge over Chop-tank river, at Dover Ferry, passed at December session 1810, chap. 112;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act in favor of Charles Lee, a free man of color, of Frederick county;

Also, the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Joseph S. Merriken, and Edward A. Slicer, of the city of Baltimore, and David S. Reynolds of Washington county;

Also, a bill entitled, an act, supplementary to an act, passed December session, eighteen hundred and thirty four, chapter 195; severally endorsed, "will pass," and severally ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the Band of United Brothers, of the city of Baltimore, endorsed "will not pass;"

Also, the bill entitled, an act relating to Aisquith street, in the city of Baltimore, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments,"

Which amendments were severally read the first and second time by special order, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the resolution requiring the Register of the Land Office of the Western Shore to transcribe a certain record therein mentioned;

Also, the resolution relating to memorials of sundry persons praying for indemnity for losses sustained by late riots in Baltimore; severally endorsed "assented to," and ordered to be engrossed;

And, delivered a bill originated in and passed by the senate, entitled, an act to incorporate the subscribers to an association for the encouragement of the fine arts, and for other purposes;

Which was read and referred to the committee on corporations.
