

TUESDAY, March 1st, 1836.

And, Mr. McLean presented a petition of John Dolan, of the city of Baltimore, praying for a divorce, a mensa et thoro, from his wife Margaret Dolan.

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on divorces,

Mr. McLean also, presented a memorial of sundry citizens of the city of Baltimore, praying an act to incorporate a company, to make a canal from some point on the Chesapeake and Ohio canal to the harbour of Baltimore,
