So the bill was passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion of Mr. Annan the house took up for consideration, the bill reported by him, entitled, a supplement to an act, passed December session 1834, chapter 293, limiting and defining the jurisdiction of the justices of the peace.

Mr. Matthews moved to strike out the enacting clause of the bill,

Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Palmer reported a bill, entitled, act to provide for building a bridge over the Long Marsh branch, at the place called the Sleeper,

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Mercer, the house took up for consideration the bill from the senate, entitled, an act to incorporate the George's creek Mining company.

On motion of Mr. Berry said bill was amended, by striking out in the first section the word 'perpetual.'

On motion of Mr. Matthews said bill was further amended by inserting after the word 'Potomac river,' in the 1st section 19th line, the following, 'near the mouth of George's creek.'

On motion of Mr. Matthews, said section was further amended, by striking out in the 21st line, the word 'usually' and inserting in lieu thereof, 'necessarily.'

On motion of Mr. Matthews, the 3d section of said bill was amended, by inserting after the word 'Governor,' in the fourth line thereof, these words, 'at Cumberland and.'

On motion of Mr. Matthews said section was further amended, by inserting after the word 'Baltimore,' in the 8th line these words, 'and the town of Cumberland.'

On motion of Mr. Matthews said bill was amended, by inserting after the word 'Washington,' in the 5th section, the words, 'and the town of Cumberland.'
