Mr. Burchenal, submitted the following resolution;

By the House of Delegates,

April 1st, 1836.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, that in all cases where the Governor and Council be required to publish laws of a public nature, they shall have the same printed in one newspaper in each of the counties in this State, in which a paper is published, and in two newspapers in the City of Baltimore, and the Governor is hereby authorised to draw on the Treasurer of the Western Shore for the amount necessary to pay the cost of such publication; provided that not more than seventy five cents be allowed for each square of eighteen lines printed in Long Primer, Bugeois, or Brevier type,—and the Governor and Council are requested to publish this resolution in each paper with the order for the publication of the laws, a copy of each paper to be forwarded to the executive chamber and filed by the clerk.

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Spence, from the select committee, delivered the following report.

The committee to which was refered the Governor's communication concerning the Improvement of the public circle, beg leave to report the following resolution.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Governor and Council be and they are hereby authorised and directed, to cause the wall surrounding the public circle to be finished and to draw upon the Treasurer of the Western Shore from time to time, for such sum or sums of money, as may be necessary for that purpose, not exceeding nine thousand dollars; and the said Treasurer is hereby di-
