

*Colored population*, leave for a bill to authorise the Rev. Lucien B. Wright, to carry with him beyond the State an apprenticed colored boy born of free parents 524; bill reported, passed and sent to the senate 613; returned rejected 631.

Leave for a bill for relief of John Saunders a, 529; bill reported, passed and sent to the senate 550; returned passed 594.

Further additional supplement to the act of 1825 ch. 161, relating to negroes &c. reported 541; postponed till May 703.

Leave for a bill for relief of John Ross Key, 529; bill authorising him to bring a certain negro boy into this State, reported 542; passed 607; sent to the senate 609; returned rejected 673.

Petition of Mary Grey, for permission to remain in the State 561; bill reported, passed and sent to the senate 598; returned with amendments 630; which are assented to 631.

Enquiry ordered as to authorising the clerk of Baltimore county to record a deed of manumission from Frederick Steir, to a certain negro girl Margaret, 573; bill reported 576.

Mr. Heard delivered a report from the committee on 579; see *Appendix Q*—which is concurred in, and the resolutions assented to 579.
