The said resolution was then read the second time by special order, assented to, and returned to the senate.

Also, delivered the following message,

By the Senate,
May 26th 1836.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We beg leave to return, and to ask your reconsideration of the bill entitled, a further additional supplement to an act entitled an act to regulate the inspection of tobacco.

The provisions of the act are deemed of the first and most urgent importance to our commerce in tobacco, much inconvenience being now experienced from the supposed necessity of a second inspection, from which the act purposes to relieve the trade in that article.
