

TUESDAY, May 31st. 1836.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The Proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Gilliss presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Somerset and Worcester counties, praying a declaratory act, prohibiting the Eastern Shore Rail Road Company, from erecting any bridge or other obstruction over the navigable waters of Wicomico river.

Which was read and referred to the committee on Internal Improvement.

Mr. Richardson presented a petition of sundry citizens of the city of Baltimore, praying for an act of incorporation to enable them to establish a Market Yard and Tavern in said city,

Which was read and ordered to lie on the table,

Mr. Winder submitted the following order,

Ordered, That when this house adjourn, it stands adjourned till 4 o'clock this evening for the purpose at that hour of proceeding with the bill for the promotion of internal improvement,

Which was twice read.

On motion of Mr. Brown, said order was amended by striking out these words, 'for the purpose at that hour of proceeding with the bill for the promotion of internal improvement.'

Mr. Duvall moved further to amend said order by striking out 'four,' and inserting 'five,'

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Pratt, moved to lay said order on the table,

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Burchenal, offered as a substitute for said order the following,

Ordered, That this house will not adjourn until the bill now before the house to promote internal improvement is disposed of,

Which was read,

On the question being put, will the house adopted said substitute,

It was determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put upon the adoption of the order,

Resolved in the affirmative.
