

nor and the council may direct the collectors not to collect the assessment from such person, until the general assembly shall take order therein.

*And be it enacted,* That five sensible, discreet, and experienced persons, shall be appointed in each county of this state, who shall be called Commissioners of the Tax, and they, or any three or more of them, shall be the commissioners for each county.

*And be it enacted,* That no member of the general assembly or the council, clergyman, sheriff, coroner, clerk of the general or county court, ordinary-keeper, mariner or inspector, shall be appointed a commissioner or assessor.

*And be it enacted,* That the following persons shall be and are hereby appointed commissioners for the several and respective counties of this state, to wit: Saint Mary's county, Messieurs Vernon Hebb, Ignatius Fenwick, Bennet Biscoe, Thomas Bond, and Robert Watts; for Kent county, Messieurs James M'Clean, James Pearce, Isaac Freeman, John Page, and Robert Cruckshanks; for Anne-Arundel county, Messieurs Thomas Dorsey, John Weems, Richard Harwood, junior, Thomas Watkins, and Charles Wallace; for Calvert county, Messieurs Walter Smith, Samuel Hance, Alexander Somerville, Daniel Rawlings, and Thomas Blake; for Charles county, Messieurs Josias Hawkins, Richard Barnes, Thomas Harris, Robert Young, and Zephaniah Turner; for Somerset county, Messieurs William Winder, John Adams, Thomas Slofs, Levin Wilson, and Henry Jackson; for Talbot county, Messieurs Thomas Sherwood, James Benson, Jeremiah Banning, Howes Goldsborough, and Samuel Chamberlaine; for Dorchester county, Messieurs John Henry, Robert Harrison, William Ennalls, Thomas Ennalls, and Daniel Sullivan;
