**Walter Crouch in
Corsica Maneuvers**

Chief Engineman Walter A. Crouch, USN, son of Mrs. Elsie M. Crouch of Rock Hall is partici-
pating in an international
exercise called Operation Fair-
game III in the central Medi-
terranean and on the island of
Corsica, May 16-25, while ser-
ving aboard the ammunition ship
USS Shasta.

Thirty-four American and 26
French ships are participating
in the exercise, along with
ground troops from the two
countries, United States Mar-
ines of the 2nd Battalion, 8th
Marine Regiment are taking
part, along with the French
forces. France is providing
troops from the Group Fusil-
iers Des Marins Commando,
Group Tactical Assault and
French Foreign Legion.

Maryland Alcoholism Rise Studied

Alcoholism now accounts for
nearly one-third of all Mary-
land State mental hospital pa-
tients and the growing prob-
lem of excessive drinking now
affects one Maryland family in
every ten.

A recent report from the
State's Department of Mental
Hygiene also estimated that at
least 80,000 Maryland resi-
dents now "have a drinking
problem sufficiently serious
to interfere with their normal
family relationships and work
habits."

The report pointed out that
in 1960 some 25 per cent of all
mental hospital admissions
were diagnosed as alcoholics.
That figure has grown steady-
ly until in 1964 it reached
31.2 per cent. Alcoholism ad-
missions now account for more
than "any other diagnosis,"
the report said.

More than two of every five
male admissions in 1964 were
blamed on alcohol. One in ev-
ery eight women admitted was
an alcoholic, the report said.

The report, prepared by
Kurt Gorwitz, the Depart-
ment's statistics director, point-
ed out that "nearly half of the
alcoholic patients were self-ad-
mitted but, since "many lack
the motivations necessary for

successful treatment," the in-
cidence of repeated hospitaliza-
tion after only a brief stay was
high.

Among other findings in the
State's annual report:
• Ten per cent of the pa-
tients admitted for alcoholism
in 1964 had some college educa-
tion.
• Only four-tenths of 1 per
cent of those admitted for al-
coholism treatment were Jew-
ish. Twenty-six per cent were
Catholic and 71 per cent were
Protestant.
• Fifty-three per cent of
those admitted were 25 to 44
years of age.

The report suggested that a
study of the "factors responsi-
ble for the major variations be-
tween some religious and ethnic
groups in the incidence rates of
alcoholism" could play a "ma-
jor role in the program to re-
duce the problem of alcohol-
ism."


